Note from The Head

Welcome to the first edition of this year's Ramsey Voice. As normal it has been a busy start to the term: this newsletter celebrates the activities and success of the students at the end of last term and during the past few months.

Our aim continues to encourage students to 'be the best you can be', which requires them to take opportunities and accept the challenges they face. We were pleased that the Year 11 students rose to the challenge of their GCSE & BTEC courses, producing excellent results. The recently published National Performance Tables show we have achieved results above expected progress and maintained the standards we have set ourselves. The next challenge is to 'raise the bar' further and strive for all subjects to be above national average.

To be successful, in our opinion, is more than just achieving good qualifications. Young people need to develop life skills, an awareness of the importance of the community and positive mental well-being. To achieve these aims, students are offered many opportunities to try new activities and explore the world around them. We have revised the Ramsey Achievement Award (RAA), allowing students to celebrate their success in a more structured and reflective manner.

Progress Reviews are held every half term with each student's Form Tutor and targets are set for the next few months. The RAA Badges are awarded at the end of each academic year following completion of specific criteria.

Ramsey Achievement Award Attendance

During the past few weeks many sporting events have been taking place. The Rugby World Cup in Japan has showcased the importance of teamwork and increased the awareness of a different culture. The Chicago Marathon produced a new world women's record and in Vienna, the first sub 2-hour men's marathon was completed. The latter two records highlighted the need for individual resilience as well as physical ability. However, success in all cases could not have been completed without significant input from an extensive support network. In many ways this reflects what students need to succeed in school. In addition to their personal dedication, they need the input from school staff, and support from home. If all three elements work together the chances of a successful outcome will be increased.

The words of Michael Jordan, one of the most successful basketball players of all time, are a reminder that we cannot achieve on our own:

"Talent wins games, but teamwork and intelligence wins championships."

Students must be encouraged to view their whole school experience as a 'championship' rather than a series of individual games.

It's scary to think that we have already completed half a term of Year 11 and time is passing very quickly. We are Will and Tazmin, and we are the Ramsey Academy's School Captains. In out past four years at Ramsey we've both completed a myriad of things, from performing in professional theatres, to excelling in music and winning numerous awards - and yet it still feels quite surreal to be honoured with the role of School Captain.

Bushcraft Trip

During Activities Week we took 96 year 7's on a three-day Bushcraft residential adventure to Penshurst Place, Kent.

The trip would provide fantastic development of leadership skills; demanding resourcefulness, decision-making and practical thinking from students. Each day was made up of a range of hands-on workshops, offering a chance to really get to grips with life in the outdoors within a truly unique environment.

Getting off the coach, all the students and staff were excited about the adventures ahead and the new surroundings. We had a short walk through the woods to the camps where we were shown our tents and then put into small tribes of between ten and fifteen, with each tribe assigned a Bushcraft Leader who would look after us during our visit.

The camp was in the heart of the forest, covered by huge canopy of the trees which gave us shelter from the sun which was useful as we had gone on the hottest days of the year! In the centre of the camp was a Yurt, a massive open sided tent where we all hung out together and ate our meals and spent the evenings telling stories of the day's events.

Each day started with breakfast followed by two activities, then lunch, followed by another two activities, dinner and then bed.

We guickly found out about all the fun tasks we would be doing which included: Shelter Building, Plane Crash rescue, a welcome lake swim, Wilderness First Aid, Bushcraft's Got Talent (where the camp came together for a hilarious night's entertainment), night stalking games and even a chance to eat fish eyes!

Our days were kept busy with all the activities, we only stopped for food which was plentiful and delicious. We cooked burgers on open fires, enjoyed full English breakfasts, pancakes, pasta and marshmallows over the open fires. Our sleeping tents were so hot most of the students decided to sleep out in the open for both nights or in the shelters that we built.

During our three day stay the only wash we had was our lake swim which the students loved! Also we didn't have our mobile phones and they weren't missed at all.

Quickly the time came to leave and students left with a sense of achievement, confident in their ability to live and operate in an outdoors, as well as a greater understanding of the British landscape,. Our time spent living in the wild was truly fantastic and we were all taken out of our comfort zones.

'Look for a Book' Halstead

'Look for a Book' is an initiative which has been taking off in many areas all over the country since the beginning of the summer. It takes the form of a hide-and-seek activity; children's books are hidden around an area for someone else to find and read. The finder can then choose to keep the book or re-hide it for someone else to find.

The Ramsey Academy, Halstead decided to launch the idea in Halstead as part of their Open Evening on 26 September. Staff donated almost 200 books that their own children had read and grown out of to kick-start the idea: Around 150 books ranging from picture books for babies to books for teens, were hidden around the school for Year 6 pupils and their families to find, read, keep or re-hide. A Facebook page (Look-for-a-Book-Halstead) and a Twitter

account (@BooksRamsey) were started so that hiders and finders could post photographs of where books have been hidden and where books have been found.

Each book was lovingly wrapped in a clear, waterproof wrapper along with a bookmark explaining what the initiative is and the Facebook and Twitter account details by one of Ramsey Academy's Year 9 Literacy Leaders. 




DJ Workshop


















Open Evening Success


