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Note from The Head

Welcome to the first edition of the year's Ramsey Voice. This is a bumper version as we were not able to publish one in October. We are delighted to include so many stories that highlight the positive activities of our students. Despite the challenges faced returning to school and adjusting to the ongoing disruption caused by the pandemic, many of the 'normal' activities we provide that contribute to the extended curriculum have been reintroduced. These activities combined with high quality lessons help us to achieve our aim of being an "outstanding school in the heart of the community."

Initially we would like to thank Mrs Keen, our previous Editor, who has changed roles within the school and will no longer compile this newsletter. For several years, she has collated the articles and taken the photographs to produce the Ramsey Voice, which plays an important role in celebrating the success of the students and informing parents of various support networks. The new Editor, Mrs Nally, is keen to receive specific notices from local voluntary groups and charities, for inclusion, if we have space.

The Year 11 Leavers attended their 'live virtual' Awards Evening. For the second successive year, despite not being able to see everyone in person, the awards were presented and in this most difficult of years, where so many of the normal 'leaving' activities were cancelled it was fantastic to celebrate their achievements.

Yet again, we are delighted with the number of Year 6 students applying to be part of the Ramsey Community in September 2022. We have received nearly 300 applications for 150 places and are oversubscribed, showing many families are choosing the school as their first choice in the local area.

During the term, we have re-introduced many of the activities that contribute to the extended curriculum, which is an important part of the school experience. Students have enjoyed completing elements of their Ramsey Achievement Award, attending clubs, participating in sporting and charity events, and attending several trips and visits. We hope that next term we will be able to continue to provide an increased range of activities subject to Covid-19 restrictions.

Throughout the past two years, the school and local community have worked together to offer support and provide opportunities for the young people in challenging circumstances. We know many of them have struggled in many ways. They have missed learning time, socialising with friends and missed opportunities to develop their cultural awareness. This has impacted on their well-being, and we will need to provide additional support for some time. As a school, we aim to be central in this support.

It used to be said, "students went to school to learn the 3R's – reading, writing and arithmetic". But today, we would suggest a different 3R's are also very relevant: "Respect – for self, Respect – for others, Responsibility -for own actions."

We want to work with the students and their families to encourage these new 3R's. If we can achieve these simple values, the young people will fulfil our aim and aspiration of "be the best you can be".



Specialist SEND and Mental Wellbeing Hubs are available across the county, offering tailored sessions run by specialist coaches.
















Careers Fair

On Wednesday 29th September 2021, Year 11 students visited the Careers Fair at Chelmsford City Racecourse. The fair hosted representatives from public and private sector employers, as well as universities, local colleges and training providers. It was such an exciting event; after a challenging time of little or no opportunities to meet anyone from outside the school environment, our students showed great confidence and maturity as they engaged with local businesses and education providers. We were incredibly proud of the way they conducted themselves and the very positive feedback from exhibitors reflected how impressed they were with our resilient, enthusiastic young people. Alongside local employers such as Maycast-Nokes and Milbank, local law, accountancy and care firms, students were able to talk directly to representatives from industries and institutions, as wide ranging as the chemical oil and gas industry, football and rugby academies, the Armed Forces, the Royal Horticultural Society, hair and beauty salons, recording studios, construction and mechanical engineers and 6th Form Colleges. Year 11 students are currently facing the difficult choices that will shape the next few years of their lives and, potentially, the education, training and career paths they may take for the rest of their lives. They certainly made the most of this opportunity to research and confidently ask questions about the options open to them post 16. Back at Ramsey, the students returned to take advantage of visiting speakers and personal development lessons to support them in their decisions and help them to build CVs, and prepare personal statements and professional covering letters. Whether they choose apprenticeships, A Levels, vocational programmes or employment with training, we certainly wish them the very best of luck with their application process this Autumn!

Jack Petchey Speak Out Challenge Training



On November 5th 2021, Year 10 students received training from The Jack Petchey Foundation, to aid them in taking part in the 'Speak Out' Challenge programme.

Here is what Ramsey Year 10 students, Mollie and Tetti, had to say about the experience:

"The Jack Petchey Foundation was set up to inspire and motivate young people across Essex and London, by creating exciting projects and programmes for them to get involved in. They also recognise outstanding achievements of young people by awarding them for their hard work and positive impact in their community.

When the Jack Petchey Foundation came to our school, we were lucky enough for all students in our year to participate. They split us up into different groups so that we wouldn't have to worry about speaking in front of the whole of Year 10 and it wasn't as scary. All the coaches were so friendly and confident and made us feel comfortable in speaking to them.

In the workshop, we built up to a talk on something we enjoyed. We started by stating our names and some important things about us. Over the day, we continued to build confidence, when talking about things and by answering questions that the trainers sprung on us randomly. This method was very fun and useful as it made us think quickly off the top of our head and structure what we were going to say from memory. This taught us to think quickly in difficult situations. At the end of the workshop we planned and performed a 1-2 minute speech, which was very scary! Thanks to the trainers, it was made a whole lot easier and everyone felt a lot more confident.

They also taught us how to manage our nerves by not standing awkwardly, but open with a strong stance. This would improve the performance of our speech. The trainers gave lots of examples for the speeches, by showing us what we should look like when standing up in front of everyone and how we should speak. This really helped as it gave us a clearer idea of what to do and how to perform the speech accurately.

We were also shown different example creative starts and ends to the speech, to make it more interesting and for us to use in our final talk. When planning it, we also had lots of support to guide us and the booklet we were given, really helped us give a strong structure to the speech so we wouldn't lose our way. This programme really helped us boost our confidence and we hope workshops such as these, will continue to help others over London and Essex."

Aspiration House supported 'Young Minds', a mental health charity that will be working with the school to provide support for some of our students and 'The Smile of Arran Trust', a brain tumour charity that was set up in memory of an extraordinary and inspiring young man, Arran Tosh, who lost his life to a brain tumour at age 13.





Year 11 Prom 2022



Year 9 Bronze Duke of Edinburgh's Award




