## Year 7 Summer Term PSHE Lesson Curriculum Overview

I am writing to let you know the curriculum overview for PSHE lessons in Year 7 during the Summer Term is as follows:

## Summer Term

**Relationships**: Building Relationships – Students will spend a half term exploring what selfworth is why it is important, and how to develop it, the difference between unhealthy and healthy relationships, managing expectations regarding romantic relationships and understanding what consent is, and how to seek consent and assertively communicate consent.

**Living in the Wider World:** Financial Decision Making – The final half term of year 7 will be spent learning how to make safe financial choices and managing risk taking behaviour, saving, spending and budgeting, and understanding ethical and unethical business practices and consumerism.
